PATIENT ARRIVAL

Please arrive at 7:30 AM on Wednesday, ________ to the UCSF Mt. Zion Dermatology clinic, located on the 3rd floor of 1701 Divisadero St. (cross street Sutter). Upon checking in, you will be taken to a private exam room. A written summary of your case, without your personal identification, will be posted next to your room. If you give us permission, we may photograph your skin for teaching purposes only. (Personal identifying features are excluded. If you do not wish to have photos taken, please do not sign the photo consent form.)

PATIENT EXAMINATION


Starting at 8:00am, you will be examined and briefly questioned by dermatologists and trainees (30-50 medical personnel.) You will be free to leave at the examination's completion, usually by 8:30AM. Sometimes, your dermatologist may ask you to wait until 10:30am for immediate treatment after the physician's conference.

PHYSICIAN CONFERENCE

The Physician Conference begins at 9:30am. Your history and biopsy results (if applicable) are discussed in detail. The goal is to summarize new ideas to aid in your diagnosis and care and to teach the trainees.

PATIENT FOLLOW-UP

Your dermatologist will contact you shortly after Grand Rounds by phone or email with a summary of the discussion and recommendations from the Physician Conference. DIRECTIONS

From Marin County (Highway 101): From the Golden Gate Bridge, take the "Downtown" exit to Lombard Street. Turn right on Divisadero Street and continue to UCSF Medical Center at Mount Zion.

From the East Bay and Oakland Airport (I-80): After crossing the Bay Bridge, stay in the second lane from the right. EXIT to the right on 101 North/Golden Gate Bridge. Get in the left lane and EXIT on OCTAVIA BLVD/FELL STREET. After 4 blocks, turn LEFT on FELL Street. After 1 mile, turn right on Divisadero St. and continue to UCSF Medical Center at Mount Zion.

From the San Francisco Airport and South Bay (Highway 101, I-280): As you approach San Francisco, stay in the left lane and follow the signs for 101 North/Golden Gate Bridge. EXIT to the left on 101 North/Golden Gate Bridge. Get in the left lane and EXIT on OCTAVIA BLVD/FELL STREET. After 4 blocks, turn LEFT on FELL Street. After 1 mile, turn right on Divisadero St. and continue to UCSF Medical Center at Mount Zion.

Parking: Please see the map above for public parking.

Public Transportation*: UCSF Medical Center at Mount Zion is accessible via Muni bus routes 2-Clement**, 38-Geary**, 4-Sutter, 24-Divisadero and 1-California (stop is three blocks north of the hospital at California Street and Divisadero Street).
